Sepsis is a systemic bacterial infection that causes profound immune dysregulation. The consequences are the development of life-threatening recurrent secondary infections and organ failure. Previous work of the lab has shown that an altered differentiation of dendritic cells in the bone marrow towards a "dysfunctional" phenotype contributes to the enhanced susceptibility to secondary infections during sepsis due to so far unknown mechanisms.

The aim of the project is to decipher the role of T lymphocytes in the differentiation of "dysfunctional" dendritic cells during sepsis using diverse techniques (animal experiments, organ preparation and isolation of primary cells, FACS, cell culture, protein quantification, transcriptomics, imaging, etc.)

The RTG 1949 focuses on the interaction between innate and adaptive immunity in infectious diseases and offers an outstanding education in the fields of infectious diseases and immunity to excellent young academics from natural sciences and medicine. The 3-year structured program of the RTG consists of scientific and clinical seminars, method courses, retreats, lab rotations, soft skill workshops etc. The program is taught in English.

- High degree of motivation and enthusiasm in the investigation of pathomechanisms of sepsis and dendritic cells
- Deep knowledge in cellular/molecular immunology, experience in multi-color FACS, and cell culture
- Willingness to perform the sepsis model (cecal ligation and puncture) in mice (FELASA A/B is advantageous)
